Mrs Trudy Thomas Mrs Thomas is our Reading Recovery Program Teacher.

The Reading Recovery Program Program identifies Year One students who need extra support with literacy.

Mrs Thomas works with these young students in a one on one environment daily, teaching and practicing reading and writing skills aimed to accelerate the students' literacy levels. When students progress to their average reading level, they leave the program and are replaced by another student who requires assistance. Students spend between 12 and 20 weeks on the Reading Recovery Program. Mrs Thomas enjoys getting to spend time with students on an individual basis and gets to know them quite well. She is inspired by seeing how hard our with their reading students try and writing. Unfortunately the Reading Recovery is only able to assist up to eight students each year. Mrs Thomas cannot emphasize enough the importance of children reading and taking part in discussions with family and friends every day. This can include reading books but also recipes, can/jar labels, street signs and making words with magnetic letters on the fridge. Discussing what is going on around them also greatly assists children with their reading skills.

Mrs Thomas has lived in the Coffs Harbour area for the past nine years, having moved with her husband, Peter, and their children Jesse, 13 and Nicole, 9 from Sydney. She loves living here, and away from school there is nothing that she enjoys more than being with her family down at Boambee Creek Reserve.
